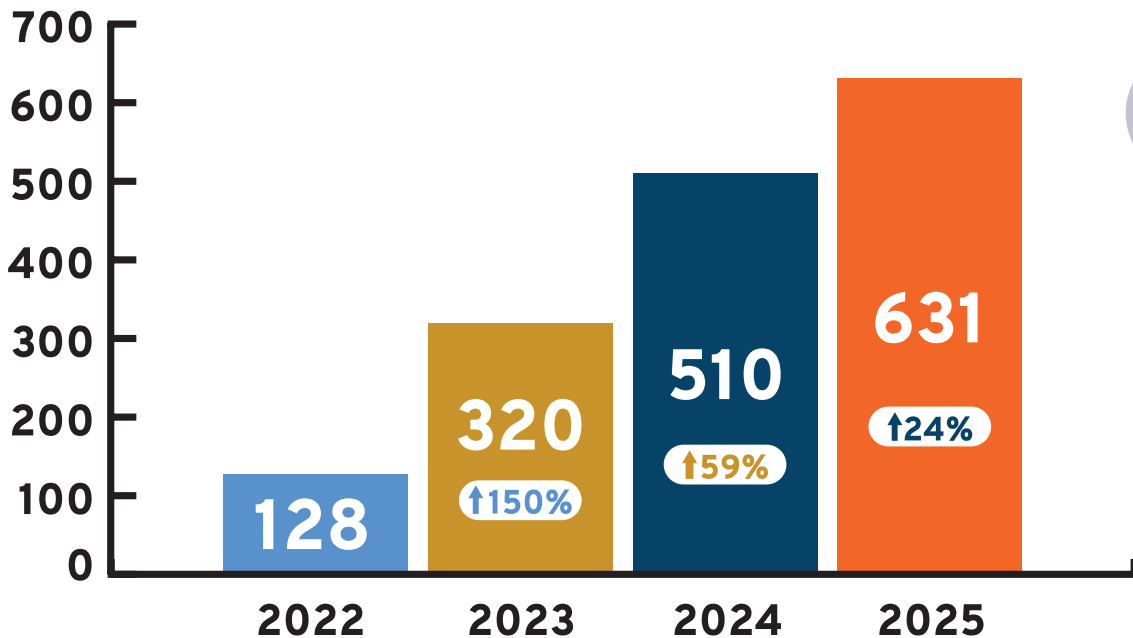

George and Scotia are “my life” and “my world,” she says.

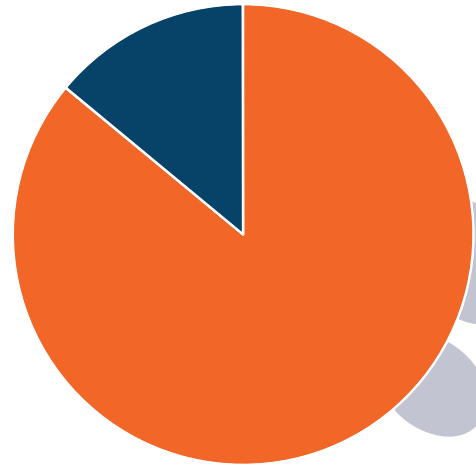
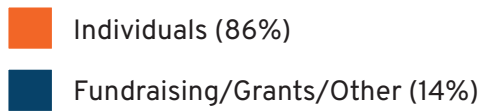
Rosie & Her Puppies

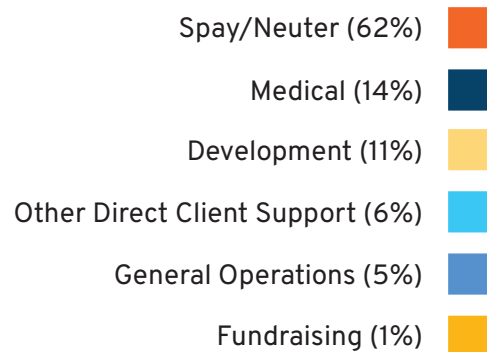
